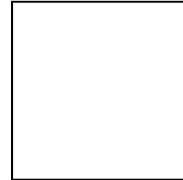

Coniferous Varieties



Eastern White Pine
Likes moist to dry woodlands and forested slopes. Excellent for wildlife. Great for areas within 50 to 75 feet of water for erosion control. Fast growth; long-living; 50 to 80 feet tall.

Norway Spruce
Likes forest plantations and cultivated sites. Prefers full to partial sun. Establishes well in Goldenrod and good for song birds. Medium to fast growth; 40 to 60 feet tall.



Black Cherry - An indigenous North American tree which will grow to between 60 to 90 feet tall, with lightly serrated, shiny, dark green leaves. Growing black cherries have low branches which tend to droop and brush the ground.

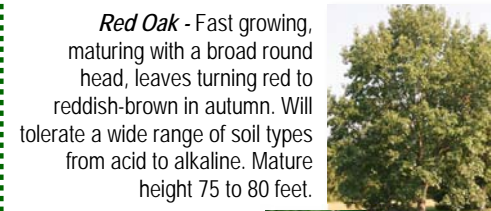


Black Walnut - Medium size, round-headed tree known chiefly for its edible nuts and prized for its fine wood in furniture construction. Grows in a variety of soils, but best in fertile, well-drained soil. Height at maturity 50 to 75 feet.

Deciduous Varieties



Sycamore - Usually grows near streams, river banks and lakes. The Sycamore can reach 98 to 130 feet in height and 4.9 to 6.6 feet in diameter. May also serve as a windbreak thanks to a strong root system that attaches the plant firmly to the ground in areas with strong winds.



Red Oak - Fast growing, maturing with a broad round head, leaves turning red to reddish-brown in autumn. Will tolerate a wide range of soil types from acid to alkaline. Mature height 75 to 80 feet.



Silky Dogwood - Shrub form of dogwood producing good wildlife cover and feed for birds. Pale blue berries with foliage turning a deep red in fall. Used for borders and screens for landscapes.



Persimmon - Growing to 60 feet, this native tree does well in difficult, extremely dry soils. Fragrant white flowers in spring yield orange edible fruit in the fall.



Black Chokeberry - Very adaptable shrub. 1.5 to 3 feet tall, producing red to purple fruit in fall. Shade tolerant, preferring wet bog or swampy soils. Valuable fall and winter food source for wildlife.

Fruit-Bearing Varieties

****Apples require a second variety for pollination. Peaches, blueberries, and raspberries do not require a separate pollinator, but may produce more fruit if one is used****

Honeycrisp Apples - Fruit averages 3 inches and up, matures ten days before Red Delicious and stores well. Outstanding winter hardiness gives this variety excellent potential for northern growing regions. Moderately resistant to apple scab. Tree is non-vigorous and late blooming.



Pink Lady® Ruby Pink Variety Apples - Medium to large fruit, crisp with a sweet-tart flavor and a long storage life. Develops full flavor after four weeks in storage. Because of the low chilling requirement and the naturally high vigor of this variety, it may be planted in a range of sites, including warm climates and weak soils.

Redhaven Peaches - The standard for the Northeast peach industry, the Redhaven is vigorous, very bud-hardy, and productive. Fruit is medium-sized and colors to a brilliant red.



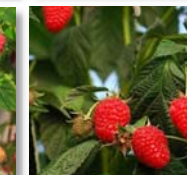
John Boy Peaches - This peach has now claimed a prominent status as a commercial peach variety. Fruit is large and very firm. The tree is vigorous and productive with good resistance to bacterial leaf spot.

Patriot Blueberries - Large, delicately sweet flavored berries in early July. Adaptable to many soil types; may perform better in wetter soils. Showy white blooms in the spring, dark green summer foliage, and fiery orange-red fall colors.



Chanticleer Blueberries - Considered the earliest ripening northern highbush variety. Medium to large fruit size with mostly sweet flavor. Vigorous and very productive.

Boyne Raspberries - June bearing. Very winter hardy and productive. Berries are dark red and small to medium-sized. Plants are naturally short.



Heritage Raspberries - Everbearing. Fruit is dark red, large, and extra-sweet. Great for freezing, canning, and eating fresh. Self-supporting shrub does not require a trellis and is cold-hardy.
