

Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) Fall 2018

Course Description

The Emergency Medical Technician is described in the National EMS Scope of Practice as basic emergency care and transportation for critical and emergency patients who access the emergency medical system. This individual will possess the basic knowledge and skills necessary to provide patient care and transportation. Emergency Medical Technicians function as part of a comprehensive EMS response under medical oversight. They perform interventions with the basic equipment typically found on an ambulance. They are a link from the scene to the emergency health system. This course will meet the National EMS Education Standards and Instructional Guidelines for Emergency Medical Technician and prepare the participant for National Registry cognitive and psychomotor examinations at the EMT level.

Course Delivery

A flipped mastery learning model will be utilized in the delivery of course content. A flipped model utilizes internet based, streaming video education. Participants will be required to independently watch pre-recorded videos that support understanding and remembering key concepts from reading textbook chapters. Face-to-face practical learning includes case studies and skill drills to apply their understanding with hands-on activities. Experiential learning during ambulance rotations afford “real-world” immersion into the environment of practice. Mastery of content will be required and measured by computer-based examinations and practical skill performance.

Admissions & Program Requirements

1. 16 years of age or older (Parental/ Guardian Consent Required).
2. Computer with high-speed internet access (capable of streaming video). A system check can be done at learn.pct.edu/d2i/systemcheck
3. 10 Patient Contacts through program approved locations. Students may complete 5 with their home agency.
4. Obtain PSP, ChildLine, and FBI fingerprint clearances (ALL 3 are required by the first week of class).
5. Obtain a minimum of 75% on program exams.
6. Complete 50 hours video based online lecture and 100 hours in-person practical sessions.
7. Meet attendance requirements for the program.
8. Successfully complete the practical content taught during in-person sessions.
9. Completion of course Co-Requisites required by the PA Department of Health: ICS 100; IS 700; HazMat Awareness Level (must be less than 1 year old at time of NREMT testing)
