FAIR HOUSING RESOLUTION

Resolution R-5-26

LET IT BE KNOWN TO ALL PERSONS of Tioga County that discrimination in the sale, rental, leasing, financing of housing or land to be used for construction of housing, or in the provision of brokerage services because of race, color, sex, national origin, religion, familial status(families with children), or handicap (disability) is prohibited by Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968 (Federal Fair Housing Law) and the Pennsylvania Human Relations Act adds the additional protected classes of age and ancestry. It is the policy of Tioga County to implement programs to ensure equal opportunity in housing for all persons regardless of race, color, sex, national origin, religion, familial status, handicap (disability), age and ancestry. Therefore, Tioga County does hereby pass the following resolution.

BE IT RESOLVED, that within available resources Tioga County will assist all persons who feel they have been discriminated against because of race, color, sex, national origin, religion, familial status, handicap (disability), age and ancestry to seek equity under federal and state laws by filing a complaint with the local Fair Housing Officer, Pennsylvania Human Relations Commission and the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, whichever is chosen by the person filling the complaint.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Tioga County shall make publically known this Resolution and through this publicity shall cause owners of real estate, developers, and builders to become aware of their respective responsibilities and rights under the Federal Fair Housing Law, the Pennsylvania Human Relations Act, and any local laws or ordinances.

FURTHER ACTION will at a minimum include, but not to be limited to:

- (1) Publicizing the name and contact information of the local Fair Housing Officer, which will include the process to file a complaint if a person feels they have been discriminated against in housing in any manner and other applicable fair housing information through local media and community contracts; and

- (2) Conduct at least one fair housing activity annually to better inform the public of their rights under the Fair Housing Law and Pennsylvania Human Relations Act; and
- (3) Use the fair housing logo on all materials dealing with housing programs such as but not limited to:
 - a. Public advertisements for vacancy or discussing the program
 - b. Applications for assistance
 - c. Contracts
 - d. Municipal letters dealing with the federal programs

All Entitlement Grantees for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) or HOME funds, with more than Fifteen Employees are required to have a Section 504 Officer. Be it resolved on this 14th day of April 2026 that Tioga County appoints Sean Sember to be such officer with the following responsibilities:

- a. Compile and maintain a Self – Evaluation of the grantee’s facilities, hiring practices, and citizen participation, as well as each activity funded with the aforementioned grants, to assure that there has been no discrimination in the providing of services based on race, color, national origin, sex, disability, religion, familial status, age, or ancestry.
- b. Tioga County will develop and maintain a grievance procedure that must also be adopted publically, incorporating due process standards and allowing for prompt local resolution of any complaints of discrimination based on disability. Existing grievance procedures can often be adapted to satisfy this requirement. Any individual or authorized representative who believes that they have been denied opportunities or treated differently due to their race, color, national origin, sex, disability, religion, familial status, age or ancestry may file a complaint with the Section 504 Officer. The officer must act on the complaint and maintain the records of the process for monitoring.

WHEREAS, the month of April 2026 is recognized as "Pennsylvania 811 Safe Digging Month", and the initiative supported by Pennsylvania 811, a utility notification information center with 54 years of continuous service to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, Pennsylvania 811 received a million excavation notifications in 2025, over 3,000 construction projects in Coordinate PA, and transmitted approximately 6 million notifications to their member facility owners and operators allowing essential utility and construction crews to provide vital underground services and repair of critical infrastructure to communities throughout Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, when contacting 811, at least three business days before digging, a homeowner or a contractor is connected to a unique service that notifies the appropriate underground utility operators in the municipality in which the work will be performed; and

WHEREAS, by notifying 811 of their intent to dig, the homeowner or contractor is knowingly helping to protect the underground utilities, themselves, the work crew, and their neighbors from any unsafe digging practices within their community; and

WHEREAS, upon receiving the notification from Pennsylvania 811, the facility owners and operators disperse to the said work site to mark the approximate location of their underground utility lines with flags, paint, or both, to establish an eighteen-inch tolerance zone of the outside wall or edge of their line or facility; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Tioga County, in support of the Pennsylvania Underground Utility Line Protection Law, PA Act 287 of 1974, as amended, we do hereby proclaim April 2026 as "Pennsylvania 811 Safe Digging Month", and encourage all Pennsylvanians to visit the Pennsylvania 811 website at www.paonecall.org for information about digging safely.
